Of course, we are very excited to serve our brother and

A gift for our Seminarian! We'd like to get Joe Bangert a gift in honor of his ordination into the Office of the Holy Ministry. A door offering will be collected on Sunday, June 5 to do just that. Our plan is to use the funds to purchase his first chasuble as well as do what we can to cover the expense for the meal on the day of his ordination, June 26 at 3:00 pm. Again, as the Spirit moves, please do what you can to support our brother in Christ.

Pastor Thoma and Kantor Swett sat down to discuss changes that will help to keep the service to 1 hour and 15 minutes without sacrificing confessional substance. This is what was discussed:

- The option stands for more Choir pieces to occur during the prelude.
- Notice on page 167 in the LSB (Divine Service II) that the first rubric is "A Hymn of Invocation may be sung." This is called a "may" rubric, which means we have some flexibility here. With that, the idea is to begin the service as we do with a Baptism, that is, the clergy and assistants will process in to the tolling of the bells and we'll simply begin the service right away with the Confession and Absolution.
- Don't worry. We'll sing a hymn of Invocation...sometimes, but it will happen where it is noted on page 168 right after Confession: "Introit, Psalm, or Entrance Hymn." Sometimes we'll sing a hymn. Other times we'll sing an introit or psalm.
- We will continue to exclude the Gradual from between the Old Testament and Epistle.
- Pastor will be very mindful of the length of the Prayer of the Church, beginning by removing the bids and simply praying the petitions. An idea for the bids is that we can put them into the announcements so that folks are aware.
- The Kantor will work on picking up the pace of the music. Pastor will work on shortening the length of the sermons.

We'll see how it goes and tweak it as necessary.
