Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Over the past several weeks and months, you've seen updates on our financial situation and prayerful requests for the Holy Spirit to move each of us to support the needs of His mission. While we've seen a slow and steady increase in giving, even in weeks where attendance was down slightly, we've also been watching the week of 11/22 coming where we have our mortgage, payroll, and expenses all coming due at the same time in the amount of \$35,000; a little more than twice that of our typical General Fund income on a good week. Well, the week of 11/22 is now here and at this point, we simply do not have the cash to meet the need. We've carried certain bills over where possible but eventually, they also must be paid. Note that this is not a "one-time event". In the next two weeks, we need roughly \$57,000 of General Fund income. Looking forward to the month of December, we see a similar expense overlap coming; \$37,000 of expenses the week of 12/20.

On Tuesday, November 24th, Church Council will meet to discuss possible immediate and longer term actions to meet these challenges. We ask the Lord to guide us and lead us in this process. On December 6th, we will discuss our plans in the Congregation Meeting at 3:00 P.M. Please come and be with us. We ask you to pray for us as we engage in this difficult work and support us financially as the Holy Spirit moves you. May God bless you always! In His service,
