We are so pleased to have you with us in holy worship this night to receive the Word of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Christmas Savior born to rescue the world!

We are so blessed here at Our Savior to understand by the Holy Scriptures that worship is the gracious action of our loving God to gather us here and to serve us with just what it is that we truly need – the forgiveness of sins! We are then strengthened to respond to His great love through word and song.

Tonight, you will notice that the children will be somewhat out-of-sight during portions of the service. This happens for two reasons. First and foremost, God is to get all of the attention in worship, and those who lead worship are to be passive servants delivering what our active God desires to give. If we draw too much attention to ourselves, we are missing a primary purpose and thrust of holy worship. Tonight we are blessed to have the children as those passive servants leading us to hear and see what our wonderful God has done and continues to do through the giving of His Son, Jesus!

Second, this happens for practical reasons. Because our church musician (Kantor) is also our choirmaster, it is necessary for the children as they sing to be with him in the choir loft in order that he can direct them accordingly. Together, they are passive instruments in the hands of our active Lord to give you the Good News of salvation!

What a joyful opportunity it is to be served by our Lord this night through the Office of Evening Prayer, in faithfulness to Him and according to His Word! To Him alone be all glory!

Please note: The Word of God declares: "Guard your steps when you go into the house of God. Draw near to listen rather than to offer the sacrifice of fools..." (Ecclesiastes 5:1-2). In other words, we are to maintain reverence in the midst of worship in the holy places. We humbly ask that you respect our practice of refraining from taking photos during the service.
