### A COUPLE OF USEFUL NOTES FROM PASTOR THOMA'S RECENT EMAIL NEWSLETTER

+ The Lord loves you. And most certainly is the Time of Christmas an opportunity to understand the extent to which our gracious God would go to show His love. I am starting this week's message with this emphasis so that you will consider two things.

First, Christmas is a time when folks are more inclined to attend church somewhere. Personal barriers come down and the general friendliness of the season will often overpower the personal hesitation to be in a context that they would normally avoid. Also, these same people will most likely only attempt such a venture because they have been invited by someone they know. In other words, someone actually said to them, "Hey, it's Christmas Eve, how about going to church with me tonight?" Second, I'm sure you know someone who would consider joining you for worship — if you would only ask them. The Thoma family has their eyes set upon a particular neighbor family...and we are going to hit the "go" button on the effort this weekend.

Believe it or not, in the history of the world, this is how 99% of the church's evangelism really has occurred. Not through gimmicky evangelism programs. Not through entertainment. Not through hipster efforts to seem relevant. The church is as it is because the Holy Spirit at work through the Gospel which simultaneously moves you to reach out to others in the very real grit and grime of everyday life. Christmas just so happens to be a time when, contextually, the hardness of the human shell may be a bit more fragile and the task may be a little easier. Think about it. Pray about. Maybe give it a try. You may be surprised.

+ On Wednesday night this past week we were blessed to receive the gifts of God through the efforts of our church and school children in the Office of Evening Prayer - Children's Christmas Service! What a joy it was to see the little ones serving so intently and to hear them sing what is resident in their humble little hearts! I noticed many folks in the pews being moved to tears. I certainly can understand. It's no small thing to see the Christian faith aglow in the hearts of little ones. On that note, let me add something to this while we're both thinking about it.

When I was a kid growing up in Danville, Illinois, my grandmother Dorothy (who is now with the Lord) lived in a retirement home a few miles from my house. I used to ride my bicycle over to see her pretty regularly. She was always so warm and so welcoming. I just loved going to see her. I loved it so much, I often took my friends from the neighborhood. But anyway...

There is very little to tell about her in worldly terms. While she raised seven children, there is very little trace of her in history. When she died, she didn't leave me or anyone else in the family any money or valuable possessions. This is what she left me: she left me Jesus. That was her legacy, which explains why I love her and miss her, and why she is etched so deeply into my heart. It gladdens me to remember how she loved Jesus and how she was sure to pray for her whole family so regularly and to show the love of Christ to everyone she met, a love that she learned for herself by way of the Word of God. For her, and for her young grandson sitting at her knee over 35 years ago, there could be no doubt: Jesus was her inheritance, and He was the inheritance she desired for me.

If you are a parent or grandparent, consider this when you concern yourself with the little ones in your care. First of all, get them here! Get them to where Jesus gives Himself through the powerful means of Word and Sacrament. By doing this, you are putting them into the context which serves to make them inheritors of the same treasures of Christ that are yours by faith. Second, pray for them. God hears our prayers and will keep a watchful eye just as He has promised.

+ Don't forget... The Christmas Eve service times have changed this year. There will be two services, one at 4:30 p.m. and the other at 10:30 p.m. The 7:00 p.m. service will not occur this year. Also, remember that the Sunday right after Christmas, December 27th, there will only be one Divine Service at 10:00 a.m. And finally, don't forget that during the week following December 27th, Holy Worship will occur on Thursday, December 31, New Year's Eve at 4:30 p.m. and on Friday, January 1, New Year's Day at 10:00 a.m. Consider being with us to usher in the New Year in the name of Jesus!
