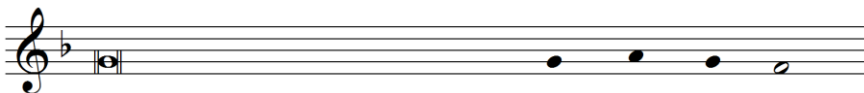

✠ THE PROCESSION WITH PALMS ✠

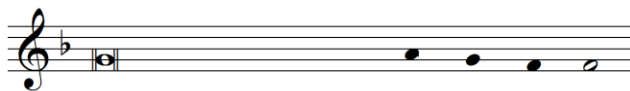
*The congregation, pastor, and assistants shall reverently gather in the lobby apart from the narthex and nave.

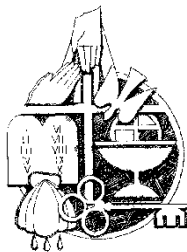
