When this is the mode, we are more likely to see, understand, and be strengthened to give and serve according to God’s perspective. That, of course, is very, VERY important. Second, we don’t use gimmicks – that is, we don’t rely on sinful man’s self-interests to successfully meet a need for support, whether it’s financial or through time and talents. What I mean is that we don’t take a challenge that may be relatively obscure to most and then twist and turn it to make it relevant in a way that is of interest to everybody so that more people will give. We give the Gospel, and from this we do our best to educate, and then we trust that God will move His people to work together as a body of believers with their eyes upon faithfulness to Christ and the support of that same Gospel here in this place and around the world.

This is great stuff. I encourage you to rejoice in it as I do, to do what you can to serve and support the work, and to let others know just how wonderful faithful stewardship can be! – Pastor Thoma+

Every two years we present a proposal to the Hilda E. Bretzlaff Foundation requesting funds which support our resource room teacher, Mrs. Linda Schrupp. We are happy to say that they have not only renewed her funding but will increase the amount to allow her to be in our building an additional half day next year. What a blessing that she will be able to assist and support even more students that may need a boost to be successful learners! In addition, they have also granted us funding to purchase new reading materials in the lower grades for the coming school year, and new science materials for grades 6-8 for school year 2017-18. This too is very exciting! The third part of the grant will provide professional development for the teaching staff to increase their skills to implement technology into their classrooms.
