C Lord, have mercy.

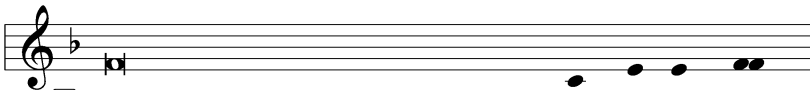

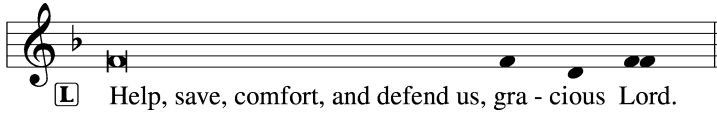

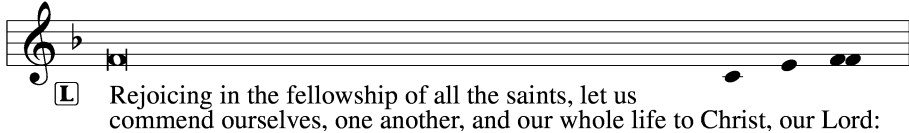

but deliver us from evil.

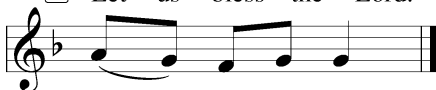
